



Behavior Expectations

Respect

- Language and actions will be respectful of self, others, property, and environment.
- Students will use appropriate voice and polite words.
- Students will care for others by being good listeners and encouraging each other.

Lunchroom Guidelines

Students will eat in a courteous and responsible manner that maintains a pleasant and clean environment. Students should walk to and from the lunch area quietly and calmly. Students will use quiet voices and keep hands, feet and food items to themselves during the course of lunch. Adult permission is required before leaving their seat.

Responsibility

- Students are responsible for taking care of their school by throwing litter in trash containers and not chewing gum at school.
- Students will demonstrate self-discipline and make good choices for themselves and towards others.
- Students are accountable for their behavior.

Toys At School

Games, electronic toys and trading cards should be kept at home. Students risk losing or damaging these items by bringing them to school.

Safety

- Students will use all school equipment appropriately.
- Students will be safe by following school procedures.
- Students will walk when at school and follow bike safety and bus safety rules.
- Students will keep themselves and others safe on the playground.

Weapons, real and toy, will not be tolerated. *Senate Bill 5307 prohibits firearms and weapons on school premises. The school board policy specifically requires the immediate expulsion of any student who carries a gun on campus. This policy extends this responsibility to include even toy guns when they are brought to school.*

Playground Guidelines

To ensure the safety of all students, the following guidelines should be followed on the playground:

- Keep hands and feet to yourself
- Play respectfully with others
- No name-calling
- Remain in designated play areas



Behavior Expectations

- Obtain permission from an adult before leaving the playground
- Leave rocks, bark, sticks, and/or other dangerous objects on the ground
- Play fighting is not allowed
- Food, gum and beverages are not allowed
- No playground balls smaller than tennis balls are allowed

Dress Code

Students are required to dress appropriately for a learning environment. Students that arrive for school dressed inappropriately will be asked to change clothing.

- Hats/hoods/bandanas are to be removed in all common indoor areas.
- Clothing that portrays gangs, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, violence, sex or inappropriate language shall not be worn.
- Chains attached to clothing are inappropriate for school dress.
- Skirts and shorts must extend past fingertips of straightened arms at side. Midriff (torsos) should be covered at all times.
- No underwear should be showing-including sports bras.
- Make-up, perfume and cologne are not allowed at school.
- Any clothing that is inappropriate to the learning environment shall not be worn at school. This includes pajama bottoms, transparent clothing, spaghetti strap or low-cut tops, and any other clothing that is revealing.

Adults are expected to dress in a manner that is appropriate for an educational setting.
